

St George Neighbourhood Partnership How subgroups work

What are subgroups?

Small groups of people interested in taking an active role in the work of the Partnership.

What's their purpose?

To get the work done!

How do they operate?

It's really up to the group members. They decide how often and where they want to meet, how they keep in touch with each other (phone, email, meetings, etc), the amount of time and level of involvement group members can give.

Within each subgroup, someone will need to take the lead role and someone will need to record notes of meetings and action taken. It's important that work is documented so everyone is clear on what is to be done and what's been achieved.

So what do they actually do?

Each subgroup is responsible for a part of the Partnership Action Plan. The Action Plan is made up of the issues raised at the public meetings and subgroups work to resolve the issues.

Role of the Steering Group

The Steering Group will provide support to subgroups and be a link to Council departments and other agencies if needed.

Subgroups feed back their progress to the Steering Group. Just remember that there are 6 subgroups feeding back, so please keep it reasonably brief! At least one member of each subgroup will need to attend Steering Group meetings so we can discuss achievements and progress.

Subgroups can request funding from the Partnership in order to support the activities of their subgroup.
