The wildlife and biodiversity potential being realised at this site, is of primary importance. Care will be needed to remove and eliminate invasive alien species from the reserve. No doubt encouragement is needed to shift the culture of dog-fouling and littering towards a respect for the natural inhabitants of the site and in this instance perhaps education through 'forest-schooling' would be one long-term strategy worth investigating here. This is an amazing site.

Comments: Dog-fouling and litter as mentioned above. Guided walks to promote and discover the ecological assets of the site. Extensive oak (<i>Quercus</i>) and other tree regrowth will need consideration in long-term plans for the site.
